

Rev Moises da Silva reported that the new semester began well. 180 students met with him in February to collect their scholarship, and a further 130 came later in the semester. For the first time, female students were provided with a Women's Health Pack. This was a colourful, discrete fabric bag containing washable cloth sanitary items. Celebrating Partnerships with Timor

On 19th April a Thanksgiving Service was held at Glebe Road Uniting Church in Ipswich to celebrate their work in Timor Leste. There has been a five-year partnership between this congregation and the Ekaristi Protestant Church in Timor Leste, and they recently completed a School Building Project at Marcello II School. This required raising \$45,000 to build 3 new classrooms at the school, which is an outreach of Ekaristi Church. 623 children attend the school and 23 teachers are employed. One of these teachers, Mr Isac Pinto de Jesus, received a TCF Scholarship for his education and he is 'paying this forward' to the next generation. He and School Principal, Mrs Leocardia de Jesus, attended the 2014 TCF annual luncheon, along with members of Team Timor and Glebe Uniting Church.

Many dignitaries attended the Thanksgiving Service including Honourable Shayne Neumann MP and the Lady Mayoress Janet Pisasale who both congratulated the congregation on their commitment and practical demonstration of their Christian faith. Rev Moises da Silva, Mrs Leocardia de Jesus and Rev Helena Malpani sent messages of thanks from Timor Leste. The service was conducted by Rev Peter Arnett, Minister at Glebe Road UC. Peter has had a long association with Timor Leste as he was on the Timor Children's Foundation Committee for some years prior to his involvement with this congregation. Many thanks to Robyn Pugh who represented TCF.

Mr Rob Floyd, Managing Director of UnitingWorld, and Mrs Sharon Robinson, UnitingWorld Representative with the Queensland Synod

also attended. Rob was the Guest Speaker and spoke of the Uniting Church's role, as described in the Basis of Union, to work for God globally. He spoke of the challenges and blessings that come from living the Christian life.
