Reflections on Timor Leste 2024

In November 2024, I travelled to East Timor with the intention of meeting local people, strengthening TCF relationships, and celebrating my recent university graduation!

Arriving in Dili for the first time in over a decade was a surprise. While the island has many more cars, and more access to technology, the extent of the poverty was unchanged.

Our first morning in Dili was spent meeting TCF scholarship students. TCF currently transfers \$30,000 a semester to support 275 university and technical college students. Each student told us about their study and how much the TCF scholarships allowed the quality of life of their whole family to improve.

Having recently graduated from university myself, I had a lot of empathy for these students who were finding study stressful, yet I knew that I could not comprehend the extent of the challenges they each faced. I have never known the responsibility of providing for my family, but they all did it every day.



On Sunday morning, we attended the IPTL congregation for church, followed by a picnic with Samaria Children's Home. This was a time of gratefulness and celebration, and we enjoyed sharing food and time together. Once again, I was amazed by the resourcefulness of the children and how many games they knew requiring only a handful of rocks or seed pods. After approximately 20 years of support the TCF Committee have ceased providing financial support to Samaria Children's home at the end of 2024. This decision has been made in conjunction with the local leadership of the children's home and has happened in a staged manner over the past three years.

Our time in Timor ended with a lovely stay at Barry's Place on Atauro Island where we enjoyed fresh coconuts and snorkeling in some of the most diverse reef in the world. It was hard to reconcile both the extreme poverty and beauty of the island.

Overall, I enjoyed my time in East Timor and valued the opportunities to explore the country and meet local people. It is always a pleasure to see first-hand how far the TCF donations can go, and how worthy the recipients are of this support.



Building Local Dental Care in Timor-Leste

For many people in Timor-Leste, access to even the most basic dental care is almost impossible. Toothaches that could be easily treated with a simple filling or extraction go unattended for months or even years. In 2024 as part of ongoing dental project the Timor Children's Foundation (TCF) Dental Project has worked alongside the Balibo House Trust Dental Clinic—not just to provide urgent treatment, but to mentor and equip local dental professionals to continue caring for their own communities.

In November, a team of six —Dr. Trish Morrison, Dr. Mark Tuffley, Karen Flynn, Dr. Malcolm Campbell, Grace Kessels (our photographer) and Mia Noronha (our local translator) —travelled to Balibo and Maliana. Our aims were to support local dentist Dr. Octavia and her team in the oral health work they do in the district. We arrived with over \$2,000 worth of dental materials and instruments, that we gave to the Balibo clinic. These donations were made possible from the money given by our generous supporters.

One of our key focuses was **mentorship and training.** We worked side by side with Dr. Octavia and her team, guiding them through patient diagnoses, treatment planning, and hands-on procedures. We also joined **Sidonia**, **the clinic's dental nurse/hygienist and oral health trainer**, **on school visits**, helping to triage the young students who needed urgent care. For many of these children, this was their first ever visit to a dentist.

Midweek, we travelled to the government-run clinic in Maliana, where the situation was even more challenging. The dental chair had no working suction, limited equipment and materials, making even basic dental treatment extremely difficult

The clinic lacked essential tools and essential dental materials and medications. Thanks to our **portable dental unit**, we were able to set up a separate treatment space and support the local staff in providing care they otherwise couldn't provide.

While we treated dozens of patients during the week, the real impact of our visit wasn't just in the work we did—it was in building up the confidence and skills of the local dental staff so they can continue providing care long after we've left.
