Tribute to Arie and Anneke van Klinken

Anneke van Klinken passed away peacefully at home in Brisbane on 19th February, aged 94. She and her late husband Arie started arranging scholarships for East Timorese church leaders in the 1990s, and remained involved in East Timor as long as their strength permitted. Anneke's last visit to Timor was a few years ago. TCF grew in part from this informal scholarship program and has built on the deep long-standing relationships that Anneke and Arie had over the years with some of our friends in East Timor. Dr Lydia Pitcher and Rev John Ruhle attended the funeral on behalf of the Foundation on Tuesday 2 March at Indooroopilly Uniting Church. Filomena and the children are well, although we continue to uphold Filomena since her husband passed away in September 2020. When Catharina returns to Dili (she has been in Australia for a few months prior to her mother passing) she will be able to provide a more detailed update.

Scholarships Update

Moises da Silva continues to meet with scholarship students prior to the commencement of each semester. He also uses funds to directly support tertiary and vocational institutions such as Dili Institute of Technology (DIT), Filuro ladies college and Don Bosco. We would also like to acknowledge the vital role that World Relief Australia (WRA) provide in giving us tax deductible gift recipient status. The current project cycle expires 31st Dec 2021 and the committee are working towards continuing the project in a sustainable way for a further three year project through WRA.

Dental Projects Update

No dental trips are planned for 2021 so Dr Malcolm Campbell has made arrangements for perishable products to be shipped to Timor and used by local dentists.

2021 APPEAL: Easter weekend Flood Recovery

Many living in Australia experienced the heavy rain over the Easter weekend this year. Unfortunately, the weather event was far more devastating with 350mm of rain falling over 2.5 days, creating extensive flooding in Timor Leste. The scale and impact has been catastrophic. The banks of the rivers and canals broke, and water poured through the streets. The ocean high tide met the land floodwaters, submerging the port. Roads and bridges have been washed away, homes and businesses have been destroyed, and power has been turned off resulting in food and precious health supplies being destroyed. Some roads leading from Dili to the Districts have been damaged resulting in food, drinking water and medical supply deliveries being affected. It is also a double calamity as Dili was in lock-down due to Covid-19 when the weather event occurred.

- Rev Moises da Silva (Coordinator for the TCF Scholarship scheme) lives on high ground, so he and his family are okay. Many of
 the students need additional support because it is hard to travel between Dili and their home towns, so their families are unable
 to send their regular support.
- Mrs Filomena da Vasconcelos (Samaria children's home) had water into the property and prepared to evacuate on the Saturday night, however water levels didn't get high enough to go into the house.

She has been concerned for others in the community who are much worse off than she and her household are.

- Rob and Catharina told us that it is the most amount of rain they have experienced in the 18 years they have lived in Dili. They are safe and have been invaluable in keeping us abreast of what is happening.
- TCF would like to support the work of Maluk Timor, a Timorese health agency, who are working hard to provide medical care and support at this time, even though much of their resources and supplies were damaged and destroyed. They have a COVID team and a HIV team. There is concern that other diseases such as dengue, diahorroea and wound infections due to dirty water will rise. TCF's financial support of Maluk Timor allow them to keep these essential services operational.
